What citation style should I use?

Different journals call for different styles, but in general:

- Sociology uses ASA style and sometimes Chicago (author-date) style.
- Anthropology uses AAA style and occasionally MLA style. AAA is similar to Chicago (author-date) style.
- Psychology uses APA style.
- Natural sciences use ACE and CSE styles and sometimes Chicago (author-date) style.
- Political Science and Public Policy use APSA and Chicago (author-date) style.
- History uses Chicago (notes-bibliography) style.
- Literature (generally) uses MLA style
